1. The information contained on this form shall be used for the sole purpose of making application to the OMHA for a House League Coaching position, obtaining the necessary police check and for no other purpose whatsoever.

Ensure to attach copies of two forms of current Photo I.D. applicable Coaching Certificates, Trainer Certificates, Speak-Out Clinic, current Canadian Police Certificate and other information pertinent to your qualifications for the position sought. **Note that with the new process for Police Records Check, a receipt of the process is no longer acceptable. You must have the actual results of findings. Depending on the level you are applying for, or the initial results of your records check, you may be required to provide fingerprints and the results in order to be considered for the position you are applying for.
 3. By completing and signing this Application, you authorize the OMHA and its representatives to contact your references and to verify the information contained herein, attached and disclosed during your interview, including previous coaching staff and team parents.
 4. Completion of this Application form DOES NOT guarantee your acceptance for a position within the OMHA.
 5. All Team Officials must have attended a Speak Out Clinic prior to being considered for a position.
 6. Should you be accepted as a house league coach, you understand that as coach you hold full responsibility for the team you are coaching, in respect to on and off ice activities as well as the team budget for the year and any equipment/jerseys for your team

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APPENDIX A:

Orleans Minor Hockey Association Coach Mentorship Program

Building a Stronger Coaching Program

The OMHA Coach Mentorship Program was developed and implemented in 2009 as a direct result of Hockey Canada's acknowledgement that the ongoing mentoring of coaches at all levels in minor hockey is the key to the future growth of coaching and player development in Canada. As a result of this initiative, the OMHA has adopted and established its own mandatory credit system for coaches at all levels. **Our program is an additional 8-10 hours on top of your coaching commitment.** The Program's seminars, workshops and on-ice activities have been developed not only to support this objective but to provide participants with new tools, techniques and talents that transcend hockey boundaries for personal development and to benefit of other sports within which they participate in a coaching capacity.

ACTIVITIES

Seminars & Whiteboard Presentations

- Whiteboard sessions, led by an HEO facilitator are conducted throughout the season
- Topics will vary from season to season
- One on ice session per season focussing on a specific topic
- Practice planning session for new coaches or review for returning coaches
- Attendance to these seminars will be tracked

On-Ice sessions

- Skating development sessions with a certified HEO instructor are scheduled for Novice and Atom age players to introduce drills and drill progressions to players and coaching staff
- **Participation of concerned Coaching staff at these IP/Novice/Atom/Peewee levels is mandatory** and will enable the coaches to be more efficient and effective in utilizing precious ice time to its fullest and teaching the player development and game skills

One-to-One Mentoring

- Mentor Coaches are assigned to each level and are available to support and assist coaches by providing advice/guidance with game and practice situations including planning, team management and overall hockey operations
